1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

During the Covid-19 Pandemic the colleges were closed sinceMarch 2020:

• As an immediate effort towards effective curriculum delivery, teachers uploaded their study material on google

classrom/college website for open availability to the students.

- The college moved to online mode of Teaching-Learning process. To facilitate this, ICT centre issued institutional email id to all faculty and all students on roll. Laptops were issued to teachers and students whoever required the same.
- MS Teams platform was provided by Delhi University. College organized an online workshop for all its faculty for MS Teams. Google meet, Zoom and all other platforms of online teaching were equally encouraged by the college, to ensure effective delivery of the curriculum among the students in a virtual mode.
- Online teaching was augmented with virtual field visits, online trainings and internships within and beyond the curriculum.
- Open Book Examinations (OBE) and Internal assessments were held according to Delhi University guidelines.
- Library e-resources were made available through remote access to ensure smooth learning by college students and faculty, when they could not come physically to the college during the lockdown period - to facilitate effective curriculum delivery.

- 4. During the pandemic period University conducted Open Book Examination (OBE) for each semester. The examination committee of the college has been actively engaged in smooth conduction of the same. The grievances of the students were taken up and sorted out accordingly.
- 5. With the help of academic calendar deadlines for submission of attendance, class tests, assignments etc. are decided to ensure continuous evaluation and to give opportunity to students for improving their performance.

Due to pandemic times, it has become need of the hour that all students should be well versed with the basics of MS-Office, as everything had shifted over to the online platform.170 students of our college successfully completed this program.

- The Special Programme for Learners, under the aegis of IQACof the college organized a two day workshop on " E-filing of Income Tax Return -ITR-1" on 14th and 15th December 2020. The objective of the workshop was to impart the skills on e-filing of ITR-1 also called as SARAL Form, especially to undergraduate students of commerce discipline. This workshop was completed by 83 students, including five students from other colleges of the University of Delhi.
- The committee for Special Program for Learners and ICT Team of DDUC under the aegis of IQACorganized an online "Training program on GIMP S/W for Govt. School Students" from 11-16 January, 2021.

The students can access online availability of reading material (text, videos etc.) related to curriculum through the 100% Wi-Fi enabled college campus. Even during the tough times of Covid pandemic, our teaching learning process did not halt. The power of ICT helped the college fraternity connect with their students. Not only was it the time when our faculty updated themselves through several programs (such as FDPs, Refresher Courses, Short Term Courses, Webinars etc) to keep a pace with this paradigm shift in the teaching pedagogy but also implemented ICT in their teaching-evaluation process in a much efficient manner.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

1. The college organizes a mandatory Orientation Program on the day of commencement of the course wherein the students are

apprised about the evaluation schedule and internal assessmentof the college under the university directives. The same is also available on the university website, notice boards, and even during regular class counseling.

- 2. The answer scripts of the class tests are shown and discussed with the students individually to ensure their satisfaction prior to their display on the college website.
- 3. The written assignments are returned to the students upon evaluation. In instances where the assignment has a scope for improvement, the faculty identifies the lacunae and an additional time is granted for re-submission. The final marks scored by the students are then notified through the college website/ notice board.
- 4. In addition to the verification of marks by the faculty associated with each paper, every department also has a Moderation Committee which ensures verification of all the assessments prior to the final submission to the office. The college notifies the schedule for verification by the moderation committee through e-mails and the college website.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

- Attendance of students for theory, practical, and tutorials is uploaded on the college internal assessment portal regularly (on monthly basis) for display.
- 2. Strategy adopted in light of Covid-19:DU adopted a special IA scheme for the final year students. Instead of the three components of IA, only Assignments were to be submitted online. The End-Semester Examinations were held as Open Book Examinations (OBE) to ensure covid protocol. Students could give OBE from the place of their convenience or at the college in offline mode. Intermediate semester/year students were graded compositely with 50% weightage for IA and 50% on the basis of their performance in previous semester/year. For Practical Examination, teachers concerned were asked to give assignments to students for online submission based on practical/lab work. Viva voce too was conducted online. In case of projects/ internships, instead of on-field

experiments, students were allowed to work on projects based on secondary data, review or software.

3. The student can also approach either the departmental Moderation Committee or the Central Monitoring Committee to resolve issues related to IA.

2.6 - Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

2.6.1 - Teachers and students are aware of the stated Programme and course outcomes of the Programmes offered by the institution.

- The institution offers undergraduate Honours and Programme courses in Science, Commerce and Arts subjects. Every year orientation programme is conducted for first year undergraduate students with an objective to delineate broad objectives of the course undertaken to study. Faculty members teaching individual subjects orient students about specific subject related outcomes and give a brief description about contents and measurable outcomes to be achieved at end of the semester and course.
- Every course has well-defined achievable and measurable outcomes meant for preparation for a better life ahead. Students develop a wide array of cognitive, affective and psychomotor skills during tenure of the study.
- 3. It also has a guest house with 08 double-bedded AC rooms along with crèche facility. The classrooms, LTs and seminar halls have LCD projector, Internet connectivity, green/ white-boards, well finished furniture. All classrooms, LTs along with the whole building are equipped with airconditioning facility. The college has provided more than 946 computers including laptops. The library is spread across three floors with centralized air-conditioning providing spacious and ambient seating arrangement. Within the span of last two years, one departmental laboratory of Mathematics, 02 seminar halls, 01 medical room and an exhibition-cum-examination hall has been added.

The campus has around 5 lakh square feet of covered area, a state of art building with various green initiatives namely provision of solar energy for street-lighting and water heating, management of ewaste system, well designed laboratories with latest scientific equipment and experimental set-ups, 48 classrooms including 12 lecture theatre having latest audio-visual aids, an auditorium and Seminar halls for seminars/conferences, art and cultural performances, artistic and aesthetic indulgences. The college has done intensive plantation over the entire campus and is also doing water harvesting since inception of the new building. The college plans to switch to paperless office as a green initiative and thus requires complete ERP solution for accounts, administration, examination system, onlinereservation of library books through college website to cater to over 2,700 students and 200 staff members.

Solid Waste Management - The college has installed a Green Waste Processor (GWR) on April 18, 2019. The machinery recycles organic rejects into solid mass and liquid compost. This compost is utilized for the green area of the campus.

Liquid Waste Management - Our institution has installed a 150 KLD sewage treatment plant (STP) based on Membrane BioReactor (MBR) Technology. The filtered water is used for gardening and flushing purposes.

Waste Recycling System - Our college has hired the services of JaagrutiTM Waste Paper Recycling Services for recycling of paper. The institution picks up the waste from our facility and transports it to Recycling Mills which treats the paper using environmentfriendly practices. The paper thus recycled is given to various institutions for office use.

Hazardous Chemicals and Radioactive Waste Management - In all science departments, hazardous chemicals are handled with utmost care under the supervision of technical assistants and faculty. Radioactive materials are not used at all in the undergraduate labs. From time to time, protocols and guidelines issued by the government are followed in the college.

- Library e-resources were made available through remote access to ensure smooth learning by college students and faculty, when they could not come physically to the college during the lockdown period - to facilitate effective curriculum delivery.

- The college organizes a mandatory Orientation Program on the day of commencement of the course wherein the students are apprised about the evaluation schedule and internal assessmentof the college under the university directives. The same is also available on the university website, notice boards, and even during regular class counseling.
- The answer scripts of the class tests are shown and discussed with the students individually to ensure their satisfaction prior to their display on the college website.
- 3. The written assignments are returned to the students upon evaluation. In instances where the assignment has a scope for improvement, the faculty identifies the lacunae and an additional time is granted for re-submission. The final marks scored by the students are then notified through the college website/ notice board.
- 4. In addition to the verification of marks by the faculty associated with each paper, every department also has a Moderation Committee which ensures verification of all the assessments prior to the final submission to the office. The college notifies the schedule for verification by the moderation committee through e-mails and the college website.

- Attendance of students for theory, practical, and tutorials is uploaded on the college internal assessment portal regularly (on monthly basis) for display.
- 2. Strategy adopted in light of Covid-19:DU adopted a special IA scheme for the final year students. Instead of the three components of IA, only Assignments were to be submitted online. The End-Semester Examinations were held as Open Book Examinations (OBE) to ensure covid protocol. Students could give OBE from the place of their convenience or at the college in offline mode. Intermediate semester/year students were graded compositely with 50% weightage for IA and 50% on the basis of their performance in previous semester/year. For Practical Examination, teachers concerned were asked to give assignments to students for online submission based on practical/lab work. Viva voce too was conducted online. In case of projects/ internships, instead of on-field experiments, students were allowed to work on projects based on secondary data, review or software.
- 3. The student can also approach either the departmental Moderation Committee or the Central Monitoring Committee to resolve issues related to IA.

6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/ perspective plan is effectively deployed

The campus has around 5 lakh square feet of covered area, a state of art building with various green initiatives namely provision of solar energy for street-lighting and water heating, management of e-waste system, well designed laboratories with latest scientific equipment and experimental set-ups, 48 classrooms including 12 lecture theatre having latest audio-visual aids, an auditorium and Seminar halls for seminars/conferences, art and cultural performances, artistic and aesthetic indulgences. The entire campus is to be made Wi-Fi with adequate computational facilities and a dedicated computer. A gymnasium with guest trainers is also created to facilitate fitness amongst students. Dedicated space for placement cell, IOAC office, examination cell, SC, ST, OBC, EWS and equal opportunity cell/officer has also been created in the campus. The college plans to switch to paper-less office as a green initiative and thus requires complete ERP solution for accounts, administration, examination system, online-reservation of library books through college website to cater to over 2,700 students and 200 staff members.

A chartered Accountant is appointed as an internal Auditor with the approval of the Governing Body and University of Delhi. Every year all the accounts, balance sheets and utilization certificates for grants received are placed with the internal auditor. The records are then verified and audited by the internal auditor.

External Audit

The college undergoes external audit through two agencies;

- 1. Local Fund Accounts (LFA), Govt. of NCT of Delhi undertakes external audit of the college annually. The auditors inspects and verify all records/accounts of the college. On completion of the audit the auditors submit their report in their office, which are subsequently forwarded to the college. Solid Waste Management - The college has installed a Green Waste Processor (GWR) on April 18, 2019. The machinery recycles organic rejects into solid mass and liquid compost. This compost is utilized for the green area of the campus.

Liquid Waste Management - Our institution has installed a 150 KLD sewage treatment plant (STP) based on Membrane BioReactor (MBR) Technology. The filtered water is used for gardening and flushing purposes.

Waste Recycling System - Our college has hired the services of JaagrutiTM Waste Paper Recycling Services for recycling of paper. The institution picks up the waste from our facility and transports it to Recycling Mills which treats the paper using environment-friendly practices. The paper thus recycled is given to various institutions for office use.

Hazardous Chemicals and Radioactive Waste Management - In all science departments, hazardous chemicals are handled with utmost care under the supervision of technical assistants and faculty. Radioactive materials are not used at all in the undergraduate labs. From time to time, protocols and guidelines issued by the government are followed in the college.
