The annual fest featured several Events Which were all hits, with numerous participation and lots of positive feedback. Even though we faced countless problems, financial, timing, and venue constraints, we ultimately emerged victorious and the event ended in a massive success, marking yet another successful Tech Marathon for the glorious year of 2025.

The Tech Marathon 2025 resulted from the combined effort, trial and error, and time devoted by the Event Heads, executives, council members, and Volunteers who worked day and night to make this event a grand success. The Preparation of this Grand Program started almost 15 days before the fateful day. There was a total of Nine events in this year's Tech Marathon, including:

- •Auction Of Bytes: There would be two teams, one who will attend the Auction and one who will code on behalf of them. The auction team will use their allocated funds to buy codes ranging from easy to medium, hard, and Extreme. Smart expenditure of funds would result in Good codes for the coding team
- •Bumble Jumble:- The Codes for the participants would be jumbled and distorted, and The participants would have to rearrange them to make meaningful lines of code.
- •Code Benders:- Pure, unfiltered competitive coding focused on speed, knowledge, and instincts. Only for people who are interested in hardcore programming
- •Blind Coding:- Participants would have to code and build programs, but the codes won't be displayed on the screen. Only the keyboard and the compiler will be shown, and the resulting codes will be hidden from the participants. Only for people who have prime confidence in their coding performance

- •**Tech Wars**:- A Quiz battle to determine who is the most tech-savvy and updated on the most recent Tech-trivia.
- •**Tech Escapade**:- A puzzle and treasure hunt based on the recent Technical happenings all over the world.
- •Turn Courts:- Facts and opinions collide in this debate competition about the most talked about Tech topics.
- •Valorant: A fast-paced tournament wherein teams of 5 people play rounds of search and destroy mode in Valorant.
- •Gaming Roulette:- A gaming event where teams collide while playing a variety of games, decided by a roulette wheel which has games ranging from action to puzzle and racing.

While Valorant and Code Benders were held online, all the rest of the events were held offline, having a scheduled time from 1:00 am to 6:30 pm, with some events overlapping and colliding due to the slight delay we had at the beginning of the Auditorium program.
