


Would you like recommend Class XII student to take admission in this college?


The Present Infrastructure of the College is 223 responses







Teaching Learning Resource

- 1. Faculty-Student Ratio with emphasis on permanent faculty
- 2. Combined metric for Faculty with PhD (or equivalent) and Experience
- 3. No. of Students in PG Programs
- 4. Annual Operational (or Recurring) Expenditure per student for previous three years pertaining to college. (Excluding maintenance of hostels and allied services)

Analysis

- Pt. No. 1 Appointments is not in our Control
- Pt. No. 2 Some Permanent and Many Adhocs are non-Ph.Ds (Nothing much can be done)
- Pt. No. 3 Lack of PG Program is stumbling block
- Pt. No. 4 Operational Expenditure on Students should increase

Suggestions

- i. Each Department should nominate upto 20% of the actual number of Second Year Students to join ONE professional society (National/International) for ONE YEAR duration and the Membership Fees to be paid from the College.
- ii. In Third Year, the membership fees of ONE Professional Society of Top 10% Students of each course should be paid from the College.
- iii. Every Department/Student Society should recommend upto 10 students per year for attending any training program/Workshop/Internship outside the college. College shall reimburse 80% of the Registration Fees, TA/DA for each student.
- iv. The Prize money for overall toppers should be increased to Rs. 3000 for Ist Prize, Rs. 2000 for IInd Prize and Rs. 1000 for IIIrd Prize.
- v. College should purchase Low Cost Laptops for College Students for Online TLR (Max. No. 1000) on or before August 31.

Research and Professional Practice

1. Combined metric for Publications (PU): 70 marks

 $PU = 70 \times f(P/FRQ)$

- P is weighted number of publications as ascertained from suitable third party sources.
- FRQ is the maximum of nominal number of faculty members as calculated on the basis of a required FSR of 1:20 or the available faculty in the institution.

Suggestions

- Cash reward of Rs. 10,000/- (and not reimbursement) towards each publication in SCOPUS/WoS Indexed Journal to Staff Member/Student (In case of SINGLE AUTHOR). In case of multiple authors (N), the cash reward to be calculated as (10,000/N). (Reward to be given for only those papers where the affiliation of the Faculty Member includes "Deen Dayal Upadhyaya College, University of Delhi".
- ii. Research Endowment Fund of the College is under utilized. Research Committee should suggest action plan for strengthening research activities in the college.
- iii. Each Department should Organize at least ONE NATIONAL and/or INTERNATIONAL Seminar/Conference/Workshop every year. Seed Money upto Rs. 1,00,000/- to be provided from Seminar/Inter-College Activity Fund and Student Induction Program.

Graduation Outcome

- 1. Percentage of graduating students (in UG/PG programs) placed in the previous three years
- 2. Percentage of graduating students (in UG/PG programs) who have been selected for higher studies in the previous three years.
- 3. median salary of graduates (in UG/PG programs) in the previous three years from an institution.

Suggestion

- i. Career Counselling Seminars at the Department Level to be made more effective.
- ii. Career Counselling and Placement Committee to develop New Strategies to attract Top Recruiters
- iii. Final Year students on admission in TOP 10 NIRF Rank Institutes of the Country should be awarded a Prize worth Rs. 10,000 and on admission in Top 10 QS Rank Institutes should be awarded a prize of Rs. 20,000.

Outreach and Inclusivity

- 1. Percentage of Students from different Countries (Region Diversity): $25 \times fraction$ of total students enrolled from other states + $5 \times fraction$ of students enrolled from other countries
- 2. NWF are the percentage of Women Faculty including the women members in senior administrative positions, such as Heads of Departments, Deans or Institute Heads. (Expectation: 50% women students and 20% women faculty)
- 3. Percentage of UG students being provided full tuition fee reimbursement by the institution to pursue their degree programs.

Suggestion

- i. Scholarship for All Foreign Students (For All Three Year) @ Rs. 15,000/- per year.
- ii. To Increase Female: Male ratio Top 20 % female students in each course to be provided Scholarship of Rs. 3,000* in first year
- iii. As far as possible, Women Faculty members should be given senior administrative positions like TIC
- iv. All EWS students should be provided full* tuition fee reimbursement.
- v. SC, ST, OBC, PwD Cell of the College should ensure that **All SC, ST, OBC Students should apply for the Merit Scholarship instituted by State and Central Government.** All those who are not able to get fellowship from Government should be provided assistance from the Institute. <u>One Faculty member per department should be notified for coordination of the same.</u>
