Report of the two-day International Conference on' Centres of Educational Excellence and Sites of Knowledge in Early India CESKE-2018): History, Dimensions and New Researches'

A Two-day International Conference on Centres of Educational Excellence and Sites of Knowledge in Early India: History, Dimensions and New Researches' was jointly organize and held by the department of History and Social Sciences and Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts-IGNCA (Under Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India, New Delhi at Deen Dayal Upadhyaya College, Dwarka, New Delhi-110078 on 12th-13th October 2018. Its inaugural session began at 9.30-45 am in our auditorium with the patron Dr. S.K.Garg, special Patron Prof. Sachhidanand Joshi, Membersecretary, IGNCA, Prof. KTS Sarao, Prof and Head, department of Buddhist Studies, University of Delhi, Prof. Pierre Sylvain Filliozat, Former Professor of Sanskrit, University of Sarbonne, Paris, France and Dr. Radha Madhav Bharadwaj, convener of the conference on the dias. Dr. Nisha Rana was the anchor. After the lighting of the lamp and Manglachararn by Dr. Arvind Sharmat of the IGNCA, Dr. S.K.Garg, Principal of the college and patron of the conference, welcomed the guests, delegates, the faculty and the students. Dr. Radha Madhav Bharadwaj, the convener of the conference introduced the theme of the conference to the audience, Prof. Sacchidanad Joshi ji delivered his chief Guest's address, Prof. KTS Sarao delivered his keynote address and vote of thanks was given by Dr. Sushma Jatoo, convener from IGNCA. It was a huge success beyond expectation as there were delegates from France, Combodia, Nepal and seven Indian Universities and six government and private academic institutions were represented, 32 papers were read, one keynote and one valedictory address were delivered, one session of half an hour was devoted to the actual Shastrarth, an ancient system of public debating involving two students and supervised by their Acharya from the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (deemed University under Min. of HRD, Govt. of India) and one 15 minutes lecture was given by the newly appointed Vice -Chancellor of the Nava Nalanda Mahavihar, deemed University under Min. of Culture. Thus the total number of lectures that were delivered in two days were 37 in all.

There were great organized Buddhist Universities, older than even the Great Greeks, there were Sanskrit colleges like Ghatikas in Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and other South Indian cities, there were village centres of excellence like Agraharas in Karnataka and other South Indian states and TOL schools in North Eastern states like Mithila in Bihar, Bengal, Assam and Orissa which played a great role in producing great teachers and pupils, wonderful poets, writers, poets, musicians, playwrights, mathematicians, martial arts experts, architects, doctors and others about which we study even now and they form the basis of our early Indian syllabi but the modern universities don't attach any importance to them and those brilliant products. This conference was held to include new researches done in this field in the last two-three decades. Such a large number of participants endorse my understanding of the significance of the subject.

A panel on women in early India was also held chaired by the scholar former Vice-chancellor Prof. Sacchidanand Joshi, Member-secretary, IGNCA and initiated by Dr. Vsundhara Filliozat, an expert on Kannada and Sanskrit Inscriptions and joined by Dr. Dimple Kaur, a renowned Kathak exponent, Dr. Bhuwan Jha, Fellow, Nehru Memorial Museum, Dr. Yuthika Mishra, Associate Professor in History at Vivekanand College and member, All India Women's Conference and Dr. Sushma Jatoo of the IGNCA. This was a brilliant session in which both the pros and cons of the issues related to women and gender were discussed and debated but the most significant part of the session was that reference to empowered women, women poets, architects, donors and donees in early Indian texts and inscriptions were presented and the seminar Hall was fully packed to enjoy the session. Dr. Dimple Kaur raised the issue about the fact as to why at all we have to assemble to discuss this gender issue and why women still suffer on different occasions.

On 12th oct. evening, Dr. Dimple Kaur presented a half an hour's dance programme with a message; RISE, WOMEN RISE. Through her mesmerizing Kathak recital, she sent the audience spell-bound with

the pathos that the women still go through in day to day life. She called all the students and many teachers on the stage and exhorted them to break the shackle, raise their voice against the injustice perpetrated against the women in their life. This was a great success- a message through dance. We thank Dr. Dimple Kaur for presenting such a mesmerizing dance recital which sent many go back with tears in their eyes and a new resolve in heart to fight for the women's cause.

The valedictory session began at around 6 pm on 13th oct. Dr. Sushma Jatoo welcomed the valedictory speaker Prof. Shalendra Raj Mehta, President, MICA, Ahmedabad, Gujarat, Dr. Yuthika Mishra presented the summary of all the papers and programmes and Dr. Radha Madhav Bharadwaj gave the vote of thanks. Dr. Bharadwaj recalled the great help rendered by respected Principal Dr. S.K.Garg and the Organising Committee members H.C.
